## **SOKRATIS PAPASTHOPOULOS**

One of Greece's favorite sons, Sokratis Papastathopoulos, is headed back to Ellada—most notably, to Olympiacos—to resume his soccer career. Sokratis signed a \$1.46 million contract to play with Olympiacos for 3 more years. The



all-time great spent 3 seasons with AEK Athens before going to Italy for 5 years to play for Genoa and AC Milan, spending 6 years in Germany, and winding up his European tour with his past 3 years in London for Arsenal.

At 32, Sokratis still has plenty left in the tank to

offer Olympiacos and the national team, for which he's been a wildly-popular midfielder since 2008. Sokratis joined the national team as then-coach Otto Rehhagel began rebuilding the team that won the European Championship in 2004, and Sokratis has been a mainstay ever since. Arsenal's club technical director said about Sokratis in his going-away press conference that he was a "model professional in every sense of the word."

## **DINOS MITOGLOU**

A 24-year-old who stands 6' I I" and played three years of NCAA Basketball in the ACC should be enough to get some interest, right? Well, according to Matteo Andreani of La Gazzeto della Sport, that's exactly what the San Antonio Spurs are feeling with Dinos Mitoglou. From 2014-17, "the Greek Deac" averaged 9.6 points and 5.4 rebounds for Wake Forest in 96 games, leaving after

his junior season to sign a professional contract with Panathinaikos. During that time, Dinos played for the national team in the 2019 Fiba World Cup qualifiers. With his Panathinaikos deal expiring this summer, any NBA team can sign him and avoid paying a buyout to the Tryfili. Mitoglou has averaged 8.8



ppg and 5.3 rpg in 18 minutes per game this year for Panathinaikos. As you can see from these highlights, Mitoglou could be ready to make the leap to the NBA.
